Notes from HOA

n February 22, 2019 the HOA Board along with three other concerned residents had a meeting in the clubhouse to discuss the critical financial condition of the HOA funds. The money in this fund has been there for many years. Recently we discovered much of the money has been depleted. We discovered these depleted funds were not due to mismanagement or illicit actions, but by overspending on things that should have not been taken from this fund.

We have over \$4000 in the fund of which \$3000 is on reserve to be used for legal fees if deemed necessary. We have come to the conclusion that in order to replenish these dollars, certain new rules will have to been implemented starting April, 2019. They are as follows:

1. HOA sponsored parties:

Residents will now pay \$3.00 for the function.

- 2. If there is entertainment, the charge for residents will be \$5.00.
- 3. Guests will pay \$10.00 per function.
- 4. Extra food from each event will be sold to offset the initial cost of the food.

It was discussed and decided that whomever is hosting the event will be responsible for everything involving the party. For example, everyone from now on will receive a ticket which they have to have to attend said function. The host/hostess will be responsible for selling and collecting the money for the event.

He/she will also be responsible for the shopping, set up, and clean up of the clubhouse when the party is over. The host will also be in charge of selling leftover food. The clubhouse should be left as how it was found.

Any decorations for the event will come out of the monthly dollar allocated for that month. If only 20 people sign up for the event, the party will be cancelled.

Starting in April, all persons attending a function will have to provide their own dishes, silverware and napkins. Soda or drinks will not be provided.

BYOB

The cutoff time for parties will be one week prior to the event (no exceptions). This is so that the host will purchase only whatever is needed for the party.

The monies provided by E.L.S. for the monthly parties should be more than sufficient to fund such party. If additional monies are needed, they will have to be approved by the treasurer, or Asst. Treasurer.

The reason we are instituting these new policies (for those of you who remember way back) the residents and guests were always charged for parties even before the previous owners and E.L.S. contributed money for parties, is to try to replenish the HOA Fund.



Another large expenditure is: we pay almost \$800 a year for insurances that are mandatory for all mobile home parks in the state of Florida.

Somehow we need to replenish this money, thus the reason for the new policies being instated. Lastly, the garage sale, in the past, has always been a big money maker for HOA. This past month's proceeds wasn't that great (\$720.00). It is still undecided as to whether we will continue to have community garage sales in the future.

- April 13. Men's brunch. This is when the men in the park do the cooking 10 am we will have mimosas and 11am breakfast is served. Please remember residents must pay \$3.00 to attend. Tickets must be purchased from Wally Schultz lot 96 by April 6. If 20 tickets are not sold there will not be a party. There are no refunds for purchased tickets unless the party is cancelled. Bring your own place settings.
- April 18 Farewell Party. 5 pm Happy Hour, 6 pm dinner and 7pm Music provided by Do Wop Duo. Tickets must be purchased by April 11 from Kathy Schultz lot 96. Price is \$5.00 for residents and \$10.00 for guests. Bring your own place settings.

At all activities we will sell 50/50 tickets.

In order to continue to have parties we must have new people agree to host and/or help out. The same 5 people have hosted or helped at every party this season. They are getting tired of doing all the work. Most of us walk into a function, sit down eat and walk out. We never give a thought to how the food got there. That has to change. There will be an activities meeting on April 2 at 6pm(prior to the HOA) meeting. At this meeting people will volunteer to host a party. If we do not get a host for a party it will be cancelled. We will be assigning parties for the rest of 2019. Please show up and volunteer.

• Catch some z's. Not getting enough sleep due to conditions like insomnia or sleep apnea may result in problems with memory and thinking.

How to help a friend with depression

ne in six people will experience serious depression during their lifetime, and knowing what to say and how to act around them can help them cope with the condition better. From the HuffPost website come these suggestions for helping friends and family deal with their depression:

• Listen. Don't offer solutions nor try to "fix" things. Most people with depression have heard suggestions. They mostly just want someone to listen to them.

• **Help out**. Many people with depression find themselves unable to perform everyday, routine tasks. Offer to do some household chores that they can't handle.

• Make specific offers. Don't just say, "Is there anything I can do?" Instead, volunteer with specific suggestions: "Can I do your laundry?" or, "Would you like me to take you grocery shopping?"

• **Be patient**. Try to remember what they're going through. If they're sad, frustrated, or lethargic, don't insist that they feel better. Reassure them that you still care about them.

• Send a quick text. A joke or cartoon can brighten your friend's day and signal that you're thinking of him or her.

• **Don't take things personally**. Depressed people sometimes resist efforts to help. They may withdraw into themselves and shut others out. Don't abandon them. Remember that it's the depression talking, not the person inside.

• Offer reassurance. Don't be a Pollyanna, but remind them that they're good people and strong enough to get over this. Even if they don't respond, hearing such reassuring words will help.



• Tell them it's all right. Don't blame them for their depression, nor let them blame themselves. Tell them that it's OK not to feel OK all the time.

• Share small gifts. Bring a treat or some flowers, or send a card letting them know you're thinking of them. A small gesture can mean a lot to someone who's depressed.





South Pole ice melting at an increased rate

ntarctic ice is melting at a more rapid pace than ever before, according to a study published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences and reported on the CBS News website.

Using satellite imagery, scientists have determined that from 1979 to 1990, the South Pole region lost an average of 40 billion tons of ice a year. From 2009 to 2017, though, that loss increased to 252 billion tons a year. This puts the Earth on a path to experience a major rise in sea levels over the next 100 years. Scientists worry that the melt-off could push the sea level up by four meters—enough to flood many coastal cities and towns and put much of south Florida underwater.

A similar rise happened some 14,000 years ago, when the oceans rose at an average of one foot a century for four centuries. That was a natural phenomenon, scientists say, but they attribute this recent rise to human activity.

Five factors that can spur inspiration

• Nature. Go outdoors. In addition to the exercise, observing what's happening around you in the outside world can open your mind to new possibilities.

• **Playfulness**. Don't be so serious! Turn your problem or opportunity into a game. This will help you relax and can offer you different approaches to finding ideas.

• Art. Try drawing a picture with colored pens or markers, or doing a painting if you have the space and equipment. Writing a poem works, too. You'll make new connections in your brain and see the world in a new way.
