We hope you will all join us for this free meal, enjoy the 4th and stay safe. - Your HOA Board of Directors


SUMMER BOWLING



Your Homeowner's Association Up-Date

Residents: A lot has been going on behind the scenes, since my last update to you. Your HOA Board is working very hard to resolve many of your issues and concerns. On a positive note, four hours



after I placed a call to Kingsley corporate headquarters, the pool and bathrooms were reopened. Shortly afterward, the library was also opened. On a sad note, Kingsley corporate promised me that they would sit down with me "in the next week or two" to discuss the over 50 concerns you have given your board members and me. I took that promise sincerely. Four weeks later I learned the gentleman that made the promise to me was in fact in our park and made no attempt to meet as promised. Not even a phone all. This management culture is simply unacceptable.

By the time you read this, we will have received our rent adjustment notice for the coming year which begins October 1. As I mentioned earlier, this is the five-year anniversary when park owners can use an alternative method of determining rent adjustments if they so wish. They can use "comparative rents of like properties in the immediate area." Since there are no like parks in the immediate area, this becomes a rather complicated and ambiguous task. Your HOA Board has already authorized me to alert our attorney of the issues we face. If you have not yet returned the Statement of Disputes and Authorization of Representation form, I urge you to do so at once. See any board member. If you fail to return the form and agree to HOA representation, I am afraid you will wish you had.

I realize the stress we all are living with each day as we deal with the uncertainty of health issues, race relations, and our own personal challenges. However, we are a Southwind family. We sincerely care for each other and look after each other. We will get through these challenges and come out stronger and happier. I am convinced that your Board will not retreat on moving your concerns forward, either by compromise and consensus, or by a more aggressive way. At least two of your concerns rise to the level of reportable actions to the state regulatory agency.

Your HOA Board and I respect your opinions and thank you for your continued support. If we ever needed to pull together, united in our cause for honest, fair and equal treatment as homeowners within Southwind, this is the time.

I hope to see everyone at our July 4th luncheon. Lyle Neumann



Hurricane suggestions

Southwind is in a mandatory evacuation if ordered by Pinellas County. Southwind Clubhouse is not hurricane approved for a shelter. Maybe in the future it might be but as of now it is not. One thing pet owners need to know is make sure you have a motel, that takes pets or you need to apply to the hurricane shelters that take pets as soon as possible. There may not be a space available. Go to the Pinellas County website for more information as to which shelters are available and lists for hurricane preparations....



Have your hurricane kit updated with batteries, insurance information, home ownership with a copy of your titles, water and non perishable food items, cereal, granola bars, pop tarts, bread, peanut butter and jelly etc. Have a hand held can opener, non electric radio, cash (remember ATM use electric), gas up car, take in any outdoor decorations, furniture anything that can cause damage. Tell someone where you are going and who you will be with. Check on your neighbors. See if they need help. The fire department will come and transport you to the shelter if needed. Remember to check with them to get on the list. If you decide not to evacuate then make sure someone knows that you have stayed at your home. Stay away from windows, have your hurricane kit with you and water and food and find a closet or bathtub to sit in. Be safe. It is even recommended that your name and SS number should be written on your arm.

Let's pray we do not get a direct hit.

he Tampa Bay area hasn't suffered a direct hit from a hurricane since 1929.

Did American Indians who roamed the land centuries ago protect Pinellas with a blessing?

Depends on who you ask, says Rui Farias, who knows about local history. A teacher of a Florida history class at St. Petersburg High, he also works as executive director of the Saint Petersburg Museum of History.

The Tocobagans' village capital was where Safety Harbor is today, but their mounds, both sacred and burial, are found from the Gandy Bridge along the peninsula to the Gulf Coast. They either wanted to protect their lands, or "they wanted hurricanes to come here and punish us for Spaniards" who arrived here around the 16th century, Farias said. He says it's less of a blessing or a curse than it is about the science behind hurricanes. But many still believe the blessing protects us.

"It's almost like when a myth becomes history," Farias said. "As time goes on, it comes true." At the history museum along the downtown waterfront, he spent the days before Irma's arrival covering Native American artifacts in plastic and moving items into a vault.

"I did everything I could to protect their artifacts," Farias said before Irma came through, letting the Tampa Bay area off the hook by weakening to a storm with less-than-catastrophic winds. Was it Indians returning the favor?

"I wasn't a believer before, but I am now," Farias said Tuesday as the sun shone over Tampa Bay. "Thank goodness for the Tocobagans is all I have to say."

Lisa Sinatra, an assistant principal at Dixie Hollins High who helped out at the shelter at St. Petersburg High, also put her faith in the legend. A Pinellas resident for 45 years, she was waiting for Irma to make a turn like Hurricane Charley did in 2004. Then, early Monday morning, Irma's sudden downgrade to a Category 2 reaffirmed her belief.

"You see?" she said. "I told you about that blessing."

On the western edge of St. Petersburg, Doris and Erik Anderson live on Sacred Lands.

Hundreds of years before them, so did the Tocobagan tribe, which built mounds along the Pinellas peninsula. Maybe to bury their own, or maybe to protect themselves from an intruder — another tribe, Spanish conquerors or a natural disaster like Hurricane Irma.

There's a 23-foot mound here at Sacred Lands in the Jungle Prada neighborhood, south of Park Street N and 22nd Avenue N. The Anderson family has owned the property since the 1940s and lived in a private residence, 13-feet above sea level behind the mound, since 1953. On Sundays, the park opens for public tours.

Some people believe American Indians here blessed the land to protect from hurricanes. Doris Anderson isn't necessarily one of them.

"I don't know if I believe that legend," she said. "I do believe in the power of God."

Despite being in an evacuation zone, the family went into Hurricane Irma planning to stay at their home. "I feel like being here," Anderson said. "It's sort of protected here."

I DO BELIEVE, YES...

es, I do believe in the Legend of the Tocobagan Indian blessing over Tampa Bay. Some call it a curse, I believe it's a blessing. Here's my story:



While I was considering moving from Laurel, MD to Florida, in 1994, I did a lot of research and traveling to determine what part of Florida I wanted to live in, and after several trips, I chose Clearwater, FL. My

research on hurricanes was a factor, but when I first saw Clearwater Beach, I was hooked. I bought my home and moved in January 1995 and have lived here in this area ever since.

My first experience with a major hurricane was on Friday the 13th of August, 2004 when Hurricane Charley was on the path headed straight to Clearwater, FL. I was horrified!!! It was anticipated to be, and was, the most devastating storm since Hurricane Andrew, in 1992.

Evacuation orders were in effect triggered by the storm and was the largest in the Tampa Bay area history! More than 800,000 people in Tampa Bay were instructed to leave, and the area roads out (US 19) were heavily clogged by evacuees bumper- to-bumper. Highways and bridges were jammed like I had never seen before (and haven't since).

After speaking with my next door neighbor, I was skeptical but oddly somewhat relieved. He was staying home, like other neighbors on my street, and he told me about the Indian Legend that protected Tampa Bay from Hurricane devastation. "We'll likely get some street flooding but I have a canoe, if we need to move to a shelter" he said. "Don't worry, it's gonna be alright" he promised.

Honestly I felt like I witnessed a miracle that day. While Charley was headed right towards Tampa Bay, a low-pressure cold front pushed the Hurricane's path to the right and it hit land in Punta Gorda, FL (to our south). This area received less than an inch of rain and winds of less than 30 miles per hour. UNBELIEVABLE!!! I slept all day Saturday and Sunday, and went back to work on Monday.

FLORIDA HISTORY OF HURRICANE CHARLEY-2004

HURRICANE CHARLEY killed 15 people directly, caused an estimated \$16 billion in property damage and left more than 1 million people without power.

1 p.m. EDT – Hurricane Charley reaches Category 4 intensity.

3:45 p.m. EDT – Hurricane Charley makes its second landfall just West of Fort Myers, Florida with 150 mph winds.

4:45 p.m. EDT – Hurricane Charley makes its third landfall at Punta Gorda, Florida with 145 mph winds.

10:30 p.m. EDT – Hurricane Charley crosses central Florida, passing near Orlando.

11:30 p.m. EDT – Hurricane Charley exits Florida near Daytona Beach.

August 14

10 a.m. EDT–Hurricane Charley makes a fourth landfall near Cape Romain, South Carolina with 80 mph winds and moves back offshore.

12 p.m. EDT – Hurricane Charley makes a fifth landfall near North Myrtle Beach, South Carolina with 75 mph winds

*** Note – I've observed year after year, that Hurricanes in the Gulf have hit the West Coast of Florida either to the north or south of Tampa Bay, as if we have a protective "bubble" around us – AMAZING!

SOMETHING WE CAN DO, WHILE STAYING AT HOME... By Terri C.

ne thing Floridians can do, during this time of the health pandemic, is prepare for Hurricane season. The time to do that is NOW, if you haven't already done it.

Tip #1 – Get your insurance information together and pack it to go when we're evacuated. Make sure you've included an **inventory of your personal property**. Go room to room taking pictures and listing the description of items, make, model, year purchased, serial number (if applicable) and receipts or replacement value of each item. You can take a video going room to room for visable proof of belongings but that should be in addition to a list. For example - In the kitchen – how many dinner plates, drinking glasses, utensils, pots and pans, appliances, etc. In the dining room, don't forget what's in the china cabinet, ceiling fixtures, keepsakes and photos, to the shed, the closets and even the laundry room. *It's important to save a "catalog" of your personal belongings list on a portable hard drive or thumb drive that doesn't take up much space and can be kept in a documents file box when you have to leave.

Tip #2 - Gather all your important documents in a secure location and **take time to find all of your key property and family information** (insurance policies, health records, financial records, pet records, identification details, home inventory) and store them in one location. Keep copies of your policy documents in a safe place. Scan or download documents, save as a pdf file and email it to yourself.

Tip #3 - Learn your evacuation route, and develop a family/ friend/ neighbor communication plan that includes emergency contact information and a plan for your pets.

Tip #4 - **Pack a supply kit**. Your supply kit should include battery powered flashlights or lanterns and radio, batteries and cell phone charger, first aid kit and medications for at least 3 days, reusable ice packs, food and water- enough for 3 days per person, and pet, games and toys, tarps or waterproof sheeting, travel size toiletries, 3-4 days of comfortable clothing, closed toed shoes and plenty of cash!

Hurricane Names

➤ ontrary to popular belief, NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) does not control the naming of tropical storms.

According to Earthsky.org: Ever wonder how hurricanes get their names? And why do hurricanes have names at all? Meteorologists long ago learned that naming tropical storms and hurricanes helps people remember the storms, communicate about them more effectively, and so stay safer if and when a particular storm strikes a coast. These experts assign names to hurricanes according to a formal list of names that is approved before the start of each hurricane season. The U.S. National Hurricane Center started this practice in the early 1950s. Now, the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) generates and maintains the list of hurricane names.
