Sprinklers. As you are all aware, sprinklers/sprinkler systems are the responsibility of the resident. Having said that, it is a good idea to periodically check out your system. Make sure the sprinkler heads are clean, debris gets stuck and they will act up, clear the grass around the head to make sure it can pop-up correctly. Once that is done check the system to ensure the heads are spraying in your lawn, not your neighbors' lawns, not down the street, not onto fences, not onto homes, <u>only</u> your lawn. You will need to check pressure from the heads as well as spray angle. No one wants to wade thru the spray from your sprinkler. And of course, check and make sure your timer is properly set. I think that covers sprinklers.

It has been brought to my attention that people are putting used paint cans in the trash. Paint is considered a hazardous chemical and must be disposed of at the hazardous disposal site. Not only is the paint being disposed of illegally, it can be spilled in the pickup process leaving a mess on our streets. <u>NO paint cans in the trash!</u> You can find disposal information at <u>www.</u> <u>pinellascounty.org/solidwaste or by calling 727-464-7500</u> and speaking to Pinellas County Solid Waste Operations.

DINING OUT:

Mokey Bones Bar & Fire Grill; 2693 Gulf to Bay Blvd, Clearwater, FL 33759; 727-712-1930; Sun – Sat. 11:00 am – 2:00 am; reservations recommended during peak hours. Five adventurous diners set forth to find a restaurant serving slow smoked Memphis style barbecue and southern side dishes. Smokey Bones comes pretty close. We started with 'Fried Pickles' with Ranch dipping sauce; 'Onion Rings' with 3 dipping sauces – Bacon Ranch, Chipoltle Mayo & Chipoltle Mayo; 'Fried Green Tomatoes' with marinara sauce for dipping. The pickles were excellent – crispy on the outside and the tangy dill flavor of the pickle inside, the sauce went very well with these (my personal favorite). The onion rings were crispy outside & tender inside. The sauces were good and not too spicy. Fried green tomatoes are a southern staple. These were crispy with tender, but not mushy, tomato inside. The marinara sauce was ok – rather non-descript but not offensive.

Moving on to the main event. Most entrees come with 2 regular sides or you can upgrade to "Premium" or "Ultra Premium". 'Sirloin Steak' (6 oz or 10 oz) with steamed broccoli & Caesar salad. The steak was cooked to perfection with great flavor. The broccoli was fresh & crisp – not overcooked. Our 2nd diner chose 'Double Trouble' which is a combo of 1/3 rack of Baby Back Ribs & 1/3 rack of St. Louis Style Ribs. Both were good, but the baby backs

were declared the best as they were more tender & the St. Louis ribs were a little more salty. This had a side of mashed potatoes which were very good. Up next were the 'Chicken Wings' tossed in a 'Sweet Brown Sugar' sauce and a side salad. The wings were large and juicy but next time this diner will try one of the BBQ sauces as the brown sugar was overly sweet. Don't despair - there are 12 sauces to choose from! If you are looking for a true comfort food try the 'Brunswick Stew'. This is a large bowl of slow smoked stew with pork, chicken, corn & tomatoes- YUM! Last but not least is 'Create Your Own Combo'. For this meal the combo was 'Baby Back Ribs', 'Beef Brisket' & 'Bourbon BBQ Chicken Breast' with coleslaw and fire-roasted corn. Everything on the plate was very good but my favorite was the brisket fork tender, melt in your mouth smoky flavor. There are 10 meat items to choose from so you could order this every time and not get bored.

Our waitress, Ashley R., was very good about not putting in our main course orders too soon so we could enjoy our appetizers and chat. She stopped by now & then to check on us and to refill drink orders. The Manager, Ray, stopped by to see how we were doing. Overall it was a pleasant evening with friends. The prices are reasonable. I did not write them down as I usually rely on the on-line menu for that. However, they are not listed on the restaurant web site. The menu is extensive so you might want to visit their web site before going to get a general idea of what you might want: www.smkeybones.com

Smokey Bones is a chain that serves good food, but I am still searching for that special, sit-down, independent BBQ joint that serves Memphis style slow smoked meats and good booze. On a scale of 1-4 I rate Smokey Bones a 3.

Search for Earthlike worlds takes a step forward

S cientists searching for Earthlike worlds beyond the solar system have a new tool: NEAR (Near Earths in the Alpha Cen Region), which began operating in May, will scan the Alpha Centauri system for habitable planets.

NEAR is a thermal coronagraph installed in a telescope in Chile that can block the light of stars and look for heat radiating from worlds in orbit. Alpha Centauri is a three-star system located 4.3 light-years away, the closest system to our world. Astronomers have already discovered planets in the system—an Earth-size planet dubbed Proxima b, orbiting the red dwarf star Proxima Centauri, and a planet candidate circling the same star.

NEAR will look at Alpha Centauri AB, a binary star system, using an upgrade to an existing instrument to block out the glare of the two stars and also compensate for the blur of Earth's own atmosphere. It's capable of spotting planets twice the size of Earth or larger.


